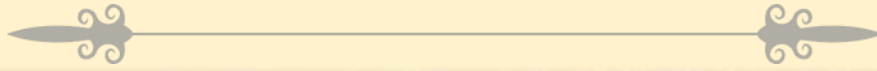




Experience Botswana's Okavango Delta with Moremi Crossings.



Moremi Crossing

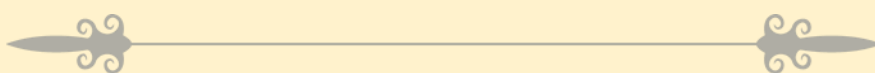
Located near the most southern part of Chief's Island, Moremi Crossing is situated on a small palm fringed and treed island called Ntswi which is surrounded by the Moremi's game-rich seasonal floodplains. Moremi Crossing is a short scenic 20-minute flight from Maun. As you fly over the Delta you can see the intricate twisting and turning of the waterways and the ever-changing colours where dry land meets Delta. In contrast to the northern Okavango Delta where the waters are fast-flowing and the channels and view is enclosed by high reeds and papyrus, the channels around Moremi Crossing offer far reaching vistas of the Moremi's floodplain, grasslands and marginal woodlands interspersed with Mokolwane palm islands.

The central dining area houses a large open plan deck that has spectacular views over the Boro River onto Chief's Island. This half-moon shaped area is built on different levels to give a spacious feel. The dining room, bar and lounge is covered by a large, thatched roof that hugs the ancient riverine tree line. The whole camp is shaded by magnificent Llala Palms, Giant Ebony, Mangosteen, Sausage and Giant Fig trees.



Accommodation

Accommodation consists of 16 en-suite and spacious tents on raised decks, each with their own veranda overlooking Chief's Island. Tents have their own eco-friendly outdoor shower heated by solar power. We have both a Family Tent sleeping four (2 adults and 2 children) and a Honeymoon Tent with an outdoor bath.





Activities and Wildlife

Time slows down at Moremi Crossing, whilst on foot or silently moving through the Delta's waterways on mokoro, in search of game. Through the provision of high-quality guiding services and custom-made boats, Moremi Crossing offers a more personalized wildlife experience.

Become part of the bustling river life along the papyrus clad banks of the Okavango Delta. Explore the wilderness with our game drives, guided bush walks, or sit back and absorb the scenery from a traditional 'mokoro' canoe. Another great way to explore the crystal-clear channels of the Boro River is by motorboat. Watch the sun set while drifting along a lagoon and sipping on sundowners. For the adventurous, we also offer a rustic island camping experience. Game drives will be available only when water levels are low. There will be no game drives when water levels are high as areas of the concession become inaccessible. Mokoros, boat cruises & fishing are also water level dependent.



Since this area normally receives floods last it contains some of the closest dry season watering points for the game that spreads out towards Nxai and Makgadikgadi Pans during the rains. Around this, there is a high density of game in the dry season but since quite a lot of the reserve is mopane woodlands (a favourite location for animals during the rains and early dry season) good game viewing is expected all year round.



This river system attracts a wide variety of game. Familiar favourites include Elephant, Buffalo, Giraffe, Kudu, Impala, Tsessebe, Hippo, Crocodile, Genet, Honey Badger and a host of Plains Game. Rare Antelope breeds including Roan, Sable & Eland, not normally seen in the Okavango region, occur here. As the Gomoti is the main water source in the area, Lion, Leopard, Cheetah and Wild Dog come down to the riverside to drink and hunt, of course!



The locations and views are spectacular with the classic flooding of the Okavango across the adjacent seasonal floodplains. For those keen on birdwatching, the combination of the wetlands and the drier Acacia and Mopane veldt provide a perfect habitat for a variety of aquatic species including Open Billed Storks, Hammerkops, Egrets, Ibis and forest/savannah dwellers including Raptors, Shrikes, Drongos, Sunbirds, Ground Hornbills and so on.

Please be advised that the use of mekoro depends on several factors beyond the camp's control – water levels, vegetation growth, changes in the Okavango's channel-structure, and hippo activity, amongst others. These can and do change quickly and unpredictably. Consequently, Moremi Crossings may not be able to offer mokoro excursions due to practical constraints or safety considerations. If this is the case, they recommend guests participate in other activities that are equally enriching and complete a full-bodied safari experience.



Facilities

The main building consists of a large open plan deck that has a spectacular view over the Boro River onto Chief's Island. This crescent-shaped area is built on different levels to give you the feeling of space. The dining room, bar and lounge are covered by a large, thatched roof that hugs the tree line. Various small private lounge areas have been created for comfort, privacy and spaciousness.



Inclusions at Moremi Crossings.

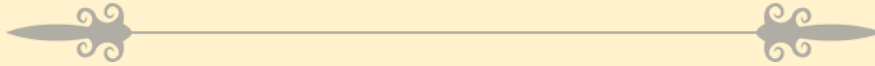
- Accommodation with all meals and beverages, (alcoholic and non-alcoholic) as well as daily laundry. Alcoholic beverages comprise of South African wines and spirits.
- All game viewing activities possible with the season
- Emergency medical evacuation cover (all guests must have their own travel and health insurance)
- Meet & greet at Maun airport
- There is no wifi, cell phone signal, in-room hair dryers, nor in-room air conditioning, in the camp.

Luggage limited to 20kg per person in small soft bags, inclusive of hand luggage. Body weight limited to 100 kg per person. An extra seat needs to be purchased if body or luggage weights are over the limit.

Accommodation

Activities

Explore the world-renowned game-filled Chobe National Park on a 3-hour morning game drive in an open-backed, open-seated safari vehicle. Witness a spectacle of wildlife as your personal and friendly guide takes you on a journey through the park in the cool stillness of the early morning. Elephant, lion, leopard, buffalo, giraffe, and zebra are just a sample of the wildlife you may encounter as you drive through the park and along the banks of the Chobe River.



Take to the waters of the Chobe River on a 3-hour sunset cruise in one of our intimate pontoon boats. Watch big game and birdlife indulge in the refreshing waters of the river as you cruise gently alongside. Your knowledgeable and friendly guide is on hand to help you identify birdlife and share knowledge on the various animals you will encounter, whilst always ensuring your absolute comfort. Enjoy a sundowner as you witness the spectacular African sunset over the water.
